**Proposed Change to By-Laws**

The following amendment was proposed by the Scholarship Committee consisting of John Mulholland, Michael A. Dantuono, Michael Byrd, John Hebrank, and Michael Campisi for submission to the Council at the May 2, 2006 meeting and to be voted on at the regular business meeting to be held on June 6, 2006.

The following change is proposed to the by-laws:

Art. VI, Sec. 7 Para.2. The Committee shall select two (2) candidates from **the children, legal ward or grandchild** of a member of the Joseph Barry Council #2520 in good standing or deceased members who were in good standing, which candidates have been accepted in an approved college, university, or post high school trade or technical school. **A grandchild must reside with the sponsoring member of the Council or within the Diocese of Rockville Centre.** The Committee shall be the sole judge of the method and manner of selection. These awards shall be for one thousand dollars (\$1,000.) each.

Art. VI, Sec. 7, Para. 3. In addition the Committee shall select two (2) candidates from **the children, legal ward or grandchild** of a member of the Joseph Barry Council #2520 in good standing or deceased members who were in good standing, which candidates have been accepted in an approved Catholic High School. . **A grandchild must reside with the sponsoring member of the Council or within the Diocese of Rockville Centre.** The candidates shall be selected from students completing their eighth (8th) year in parochial or junior high school in the month of June in the year of the award. The Committee shall be the sole judge of the method and manner of selection. These awards shall be for five hundred dollars (\$500.) each.

Art. VI, Sec. 7, New Para. **An applicant may also be a member in good standing of the Columbian Squires Program of the Joseph Barry Council.**
