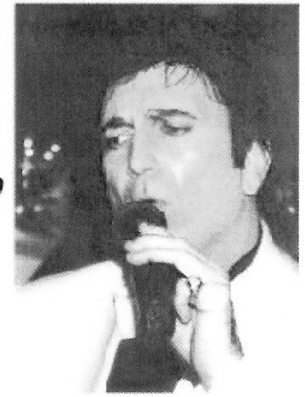

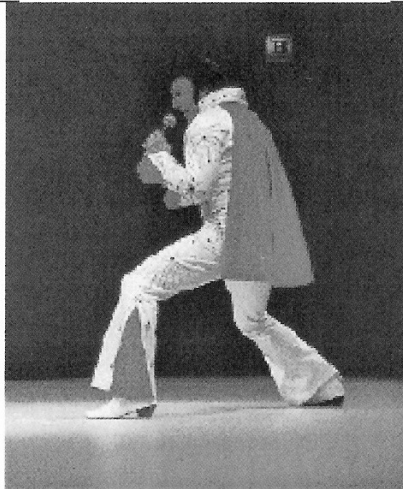

INCARNATION DOME COMMUNIQUE

Supreme Council, on behalf of the members of our Order, has made a \$1 million commitment towards the construction of the Incarnation Dome in the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, one of three unfinished domes in the Great Upper Church.

The Fourth Degree Sir Knights of their Assemblies have been asked by Supreme to assist in fulfilling this pledge with a \$3 donation per capita. Kellenberg Assembly's share of this pledge is \$1,600 with a pro rata share set for each of the Councils in the Assembly. Completion of this campaign is October 1st.

Joseph Barry Sir Knights and their Council brothers have been generous in their contributions, but the \$267. Council share is short about \$50. A spokesman for the Basilica Committee will be

speaking at the next few meetings concerning the campaign and accepting member donations towards its success. As a fraternity brother each of us is entitled to experience that deep feeling of pride that comes with being a Knight, whether it is participating at Mass with your Council brothers, marching with them in the Memorial Day Parade or perhaps knowing that you belong to a Catholic organization
